Presentation Synopsis

Dr Janelle Ward (DOC) will discuss criteria and recommendations for the release (or euthanasia) of wild birds with permanent disabilities, based on an extensive literature review.

The purpose of the review is to look at evidence of successful rehabilitation, release and post-release survival for injuries where there is uncertainty about the ability of these birds to thrive in the wild. Evidence of free-living birds surviving or breeding in the wild with disabilities is also discussed. Findings from this review should assist in triage decision-making for rehabilitators and veterinarians whether to proceed with rehabilitation or to elect euthanasia for uncertain or complex cases.
